Cultural Challenges facing members of NGUZO



Tanzanian diaspora in Ontario have been financially burdened by the death of fellow community members in the recent past.



When such deaths occur, members have had to organize numerous meetings to raise enough money for the cost of a funeral.



Contribution per family can be very expensive (e.g. between \$50 to \$100).



Not everyone has Life/Term Insurance.

Proposed Solution

 We proposed inauguration of a self-help program to support ourselves with easy (i.e., formed NGUZO).



NGUZO's Mission

- The mission of NGUZO is to:
 - help NGUZO members plan for their funerals to alleviate some or all associated costs (i.e., transportation, embalming, burial and or cremation costs).
 - Gives members a peace of mind that upon their death, they will be handled with respect and dignity at the burial of their choice
 - create an organized way of securing funds from all interested members, in a financial account, from which money will be withdrawn and given to a member beneficiary or beneficiaries promptly upon the death of a member.

NGUZO Current Status & Future Goals



Membership Eligibility

Reside in Canada

 NGUZO members relocating to other countries will not be covered, and their membership will be automatically withdrawn. NGUZO will refund only the portion of their unused commitment fees.

21 years or order

 Those under 21 are required to be registered under a parent/guardian who is a member.

Tanzania by origin/ancestry

- Both parents are Tanzanian by origin or ancestry
- One parent is Tanzanian by origin/ancestry
- One grandparent is Tanzanian by origin/ancestry
- Either spouse is Tanzanian or has Tanzanian origin/ancestry
- Are adopted child of a Tanzanian.

NGUZO Membership – March 15, 2025

- NGUZO has so far members from

 - Ontario: Greater Toronto Area/Greater Ottawa Area (Majority)



Cultural Aspects Of Funerals

Variable by

Tribe (Tanzania has > 120 tribes)

Religion (Muslims vs Christians) Key
Ingredients/common
elements (some still
present in diaspora)

You are never alone ("no privacy")

No need for appointments when going to console someone who is grieving

You may or may not know the deceased ,but you are obligated to participate

Expected to donate \$\$\$
to the grieving family
not common to ask for
"donation to your
charity of choice"

Timing

Within 24hrs. (Muslim)

Christian can wait until relatives are present

Burial place in Canada vs "Back home"

> Once back home ancestral land vs municipal burial sites vs convenient location



How long does the funeral take place?

•Depends if the deceased is a Muslim or Christian. The former funeral/burial is immediate while later can take time. From death to burial (you will not work; you will have people in your house)

Sleeping arrangement

 Family, close friends and neighbors will sleep at the bereaved family home from the time of death up until burial.
 One way of consoling the family.

Dress code

•In the past women covered themselves with Khanga or scarves and men wore dress shirts or kanzu. Recently there is a dress -up dress code e.g. white or black dresses for women and suits for men

Food

•must be served to all those who attend the wake, funeral and burial. If that stretches for a couple of days, food must be served every of those days

Departed person

•Deceased body is brought to the home/house of the deceased for the final respect. Then to a place of worship (church/mosque) for final respects as well. No funeral homes in TZ

How about cremation

 Not commonly practiced TZ but adopted by some diaspora.



Maintaining links with home country

Variable /individualized

Congregate with family friends with Tanzanian background

Travel to Tanzania with kids Immigrants (strong ties vs 1st generation immigrants (less ties)
